REPORT ON MOHYAL YOUTH CAMP AT HARIDWAR – RISHIKESH

5 JUNE 2026 TO 7 JUNE 2026

The Mohyal Youth Camp 2026, organized by the General Mohyal Sabha (GMS), was a remarkable initiative aimed at bringing together the younger generation of the Mohyal community. Held at Haridwar and Rishikesh (Shivpuri) from 5th to 7th June 2026, the camp successfully blended cultural heritage, leadership development, adventure, fellowship, and community bonding.

Planning and Preparations: Although the camp commenced on 5th June 2026, extensive planning and groundwork had begun much earlier.

A meeting was held at the GMS Office, Delhi, on 12 May 2026 and was attended by Lt Col L.R. Vaid (Retd), Shri Yogesh Mehta, Shri K.G. Mohan, Shri Ashwani Bakshi, Shri Bunty Bali (Sanjeev Bali), Shri Ashok Chibber, Shri Manu Mehta and Shri Shonik Mehta.

During the meeting, it was decided that a team would visit the proposed venue at Rishikesh / Shivpuri to assess its suitability for the Youth Camp. Site visit was organized on 17 May 2026 and was attended by Shri Yogesh Mehta, Shri K.G. Mohan, Shri Ashwani Bakshi, Shri Bunty Bali, Shri Rakesh Bali, Shri Parmod Mehta (Modi) and Shri Shonik Mehta. The team visited Shivpuri (Rishikesh) and thoroughly inspected the proposed venue. The team evaluated accommodation facilities, room allotments, rafting arrangements, sports activities, safety measures, dining facilities, and overall logistics. Their findings were subsequently submitted to the GMS Office, Delhi.

Another review meeting was later held at the GMS Office, attended by Shri Yogesh Mehta, Lt Col L R Vaid (Retd), Shri Ashwani Bakshi, Shri Manu Mehta, Shri Sanjeev Bali (Bunty), Shri Shonik Mehta, and Shri Parmod Mehta, where the final shape and structure of the Youth Camp were finalized.

A Unique Youth-Oriented Initiative: For the first time in the history of such camps, participation was exclusively limited to youth members. Parents were not allowed to accompany participants to Rishikesh / Shivpuri, encouraging independence, responsibility, and stronger bonding among the youth. Approximately 80 young Mohyals from different regions participated in the camp.

Day 1 – 5th June 2026 Mohyal Ashram, Haridwar

The organizing team reached Mohyal Ashram, Haridwar, at approximately 12:30 PM and began executing the meticulously planned arrangements.

Introduction and Cultural Session: The camp commenced with a grand introduction session where participants interacted with one another and with GMS representatives present, including: Shri Yogesh Mehta, Shri Ashwani Bakshi, Shri Manu Mehta, Shri Bunty Bali, Shri Parmod Mehta, Shri Munish Bali and Shri Shonik Mehta. The session enabled participants to understand the rich heritage, traditions, and values of the Mohyal community and strengthened the spirit of Mohyalist.

Dinner with GMS Leadership: In the evening, Shri Vinod Dutt, President, General Mohyal Sabha, joined the participants during dinner and interacted with them warmly. The rafting experience created unforgettable memories and lifelong friendships among participants.

Lunch and Campsite Activities: After rafting, participants proceeded to the campsite where lunch had been arranged.

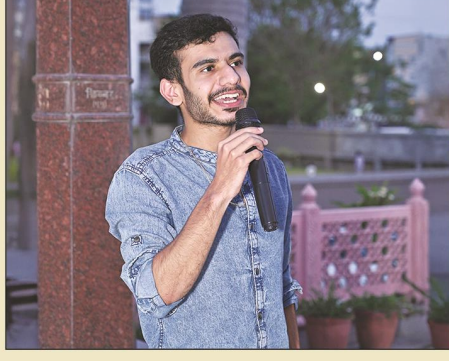
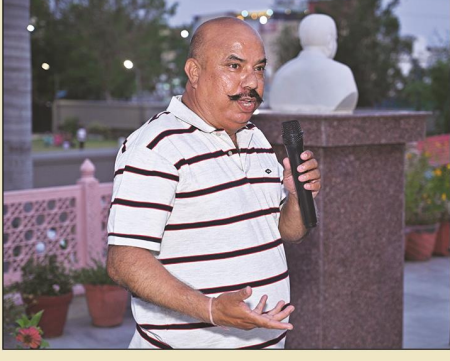

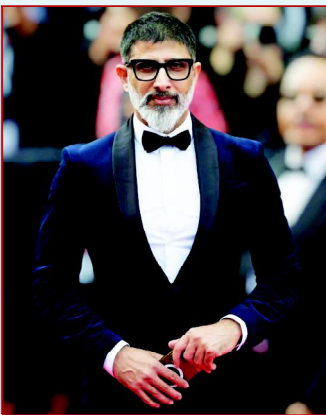

COL K S BAKSHI (AVSM) A CENTENARIAN AND DISTINGUISHED MOHYAL MILITARY LEADER



This year, Col Kanwar Sain, lovingly nicknamed 'Kit Bakshi', turned 100 years on 12 June 2026. Born at Lahore, in the 'Chhibber' family of Professor Bakshi Raghunath Sahai and Smt Lakshmi Devi, hailing from Bhera, he has led a distinguished life.

After completing basic education, Col Bakshi joined the then British Indian Army, as a commissioned officer in Punjab Regiment through the Indian Military Academy, Dehradun, on 20 May 1945, and was, thereafter, posted to MAHAR Regiment. His illustrious career in the Indian Army was highlighted by certain major events, including a tenure with the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Korea; operational command of 2 MAHAR in the 1965 Indo-Pakistan War; command of the MAHAR Regimental Centre at Saugor (Sagar) for an extraordinarily long period of 7 years and finally, being 'meritoriously' awarded the Ati Vashishta Seva Medal (AVSM) by the President of India on 10 April 1976.

His performance while holding these assignments is a testimony to his extraordinary strength and character and he has left a noteworthy and indelible mark not only professionally but also personally. His life is, indeed, an inspiration for both the Services and the Mohyal community. On joining the military, a young man is expected to become, first, a 'Gentlemen Cadet' and then, post-commissioning, a 'Gentleman Officer', that is, a 'gentleman' first and an 'officer' thereafter. Col Kit Bakshi lived strictly by this dictum in the Services, and was well-known for being caring, humble and polite to one and all who came in contact with him.

In operational situations, like the 1965 war, his conduct was par excellence. He gave full priority and focus to national interest, followed by the army and his regiment, without any compromises. He not only ensured the well-being and safety of troops and officers under his command but also stood up for what was right. During the 1965 operations, he commanded 2 MAHAR with great courage and integrity, achieving good results, notwithstanding the fact that the unit had to pay a heavy price in terms of casualties.

His command of the MAHAR Regimental Centre at Saugor was also an epic event as it brought him in close contact with the then senior-most MAHAR Regiment officer, Gen K.V. Krishna Rao, who later became the Army Chief. Col Kit Bakshi's expert understanding and handling of regimental issues ensured that he became a close associate and adviser on such matters to Gen Krishna Rao, and remained so till his demise. Further, his deft and humane handling of regimental matters increased his respect in the MAHAR Regiment, both among the men and the officers.

Though related to us through his wife, late Smt Kamal Bakshi, he has been my mentor and guide since I have known him. He is currently staying at Secunderabad with his son, Hamir Bakshi, daughter-in-law, Anu Bakshi, and two grandchildren, Yash and Jayant. The great care, affection and respect with which his family is looking after him is indeed praiseworthy and exceptional.

We wish Col Bakshi yet more years of happy and comfortable life ahead, by God's grace.

After declaring the meeting open by the chair, Ms. Seema Bakshi recited the Mohyal Prarthana. Thereafter, Shri Pardeep Kumar Bali read out the names of the revered members of the baradari, who left us for heavenly abode:

- (i) Late Shri Kundan Lal Dutta, Narwal Pain, Jammu
- (ii) Late Shri Khushal Bali, Channi Himmat, Jammu
- (iii) Late Shri Kasturi Lal Vaid, Patoli Brahmana, Jammu

The House observed two minutes' silence as a mark of respect for the departed souls.

The President while welcoming the members present laid emphasis on importance of participation in large numbers which not only makes the forum more interactive and inclusive but also makes the platform conducive for baradari bonhomie and constructive view making.

He apprised the house of the achievements made so far by the EC and highlighted the headways made in implementation of the following programmes with the active support and participation of Executive Committee (EC) team:

- (a) Implementation of the 'Parshuram Annapurna Scheme' for the weaker and last-in-queue of the baradari families– 1st phase of ration distribution and 2nd phase of 'Skill Development Workshop'.
- (b) Successful mobilization of funds from Excise and Taxation Department under its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative for setting up of a Library-cum-Study Centre.
- (c) Timely compilation and preparation of the books of accounts for the financial year 2025-26.
- (d) Computerization of the Membership record and other essential data/information.
- (e) Arrangement of Medical Camps.
- (f) Initiating Construction/modification/alteration of Sabha's premises.

Giving outlines of the above initiative and recording his satisfaction and participation of the EC team The President informed that details will be conveyed by the General Secretary in his report. He also revealed the future programmes outlined by EC, which inter-alia includes:

- Organizing the Biradari Picnic.
- Conducting the Annual General Meeting.
- Establishment of a Mohyal Library.
- Commencement of the first phase of construction over the existing building.
- Renovation of the Mandir and installation of Parshuram and Sapt-Rishi idols.

He also informed the house that Sabha has invited Hon'ble MLA of the area i.e. Jammu West Shri Arvind Gupta in the meeting today and is expected to visit the Sabha at 12.00 noon. He will interact with the Biradari and will also discuss matters concerning the community and the Sabha Premises/Mohyal Saraswati Mandir. He then calls upon the General Secretary to place his report for the information of Baradari.

Shri M M Bakshi, Gen Secretary welcomed the gathering with the slogan "Jai Mohyal" and informed the house that ever since assuming charge of affairs of the Sabha the team under the President has resorted in conducting separate meetings of EC and Monthly meetings of baradari. The feedback and constructive suggestions received from the baradari are discussed in the EC meetings and taken for implementation on relative merits. Against this backdrop he endorsed the sentiments of the president and called upon the baradari to participate in monthly meetings in large numbers.

He endorsed the views expressed by the President regarding the progress achieved so far. He emphasized that much more collective effort would be required in the future to realize the aspirations of the Biradari. He then picked up the following cardinal issues for information and discussion:

The House was informed that through the efforts of Shri N K Bali Sabha has been successful in mobilizing funds of Rs 2 lacs from, Excise Commissioner J&K Shri Subash Chhibber, under CSR initiatives for establishment of the library-cum-study centre in the Sabha's premises. The work is in progress, and it is expected that the library will become functional before the next monthly meeting, enabling the children of the Biradari to derive benefit from the facility. It was also informed that members of the baradari have volunteered to donate books for Library, the procurement work of which would commence once the basic infrastructure is put in place.

The House applauded the efforts of the Executive Committee, particularly Shri N K Bali, Senior Vice President, for pursuing the matter diligently and expressed gratitude to Shri Subash Chhibber for his generosity towards the Biradari.

The General Secretary informed the House that the Executive Committee had initially proposed organizing the Biradari Picnic at Pancheri, Udhampur. Before finalizing the programme, Shri Anil Deep Mehta, Shri Arun Chhibber and the General Secretary visited the site to assess the arrangements. It was observed that the road condition leading to Pancheri was poor and the journey by bus would take nearly four hours one way, making it an eight to nine-hour round trip. Consequently, the objective of a one-day outing would not be served unless the participants stay there for the night. He then sought opinion from the house for this site.

The House unanimously rejected the proposal for Pancheri and preferred a one-day to-and-fro excursion. One of the senior members suggested that Sud-Mahadev would be appropriate alternate venue. The Executive Committee took note of the suggestions and decided to finalize the place and timing in accordance with the convenience of the Biradari. Accordingly, the matter was deferred for the time being.

The House was informed that as per extant Central Society Act norms it is mandatory, especially for the Registered entities, to hold Annual General Meeting (AGM) within six months of the closure of the previous financial year i.e. before 30th September each year and difference between two consecutive AGMs should not be more than 18 months. Accordingly, EC has in its last meeting finalized 28th September 2026. The agenda and exact schedule of it will be notified separately in due course of time. It was also informed that though the scheduled AGM will be open for whole baradari to participate but in case of division on certain issues voting right can be exercised by the permanent members only.

As has been already in the knowledge of the baradari that Sabha has embarked on a very important task of construction/renovation of the Mohyal Bhawan Jammu Gen Secretary informed that if all goes as per plan the construction work may commence after Diwali. In the meantime, efforts are being made to mobilize contributions from members of the Biradari and other communities so as to raise at least Rs 15 lakh in the sinking Building Fund Account.

Further, at the request of the Sabha, Hon'ble MLA Jammu West, Shri Arvind Gupta, kindly agreed to visit the Mandir premises. The Sabha proposed to request him to provide maximum possible financial assistance for the construction project so that both the Biradari and the larger society could benefit from the facilities being created.

Some members of the Biradari have contributed to the Building Fund exclusively for the installation of the Idol of Rishi from their respective clan from where they drive their 'Gotra'. Prominent amongst these include the following:

- Shri Ashok Vaid and Mrs Shanta Vaid from Jammu – towards installation of the Vaid Clan Rishi.
- Smt Sunita Bali wife of late Shri T N Bali, from Shimla (HP) – towards installation of the Bali Clan Rishi.
- Ms Raka Mehta, sister of President JKMS Shri Anil Deep Mehta from Panchkula (Haryana) – towards idol of Rishi Vashisth of Lau clan.

Shri Subash Bali of Vasant Vihar Talab Tilloo Jammu donated Rs 2100/- as his son is blessed with a son.

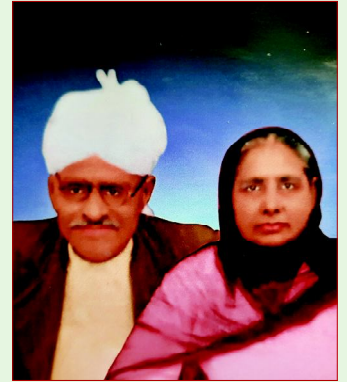

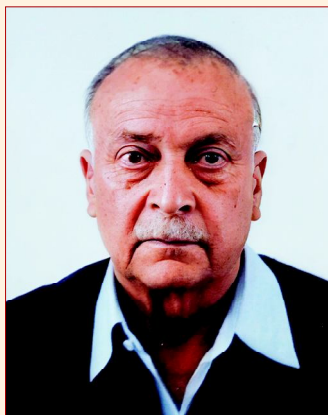

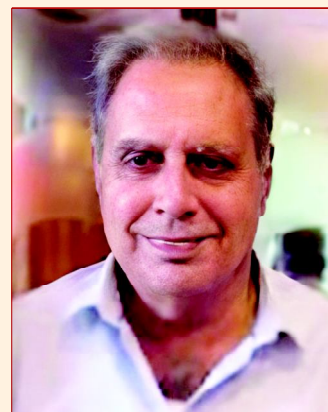


She was very intelligent student and did her studies at Dev Samaj Girls School Ambala City. After marriage on 23 November 1957 she made a determination to give her children good education.

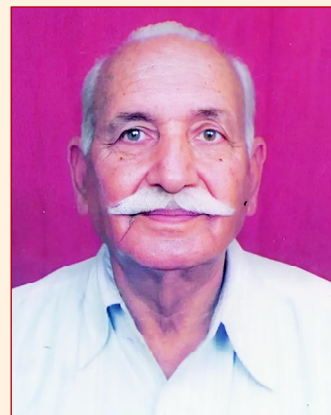

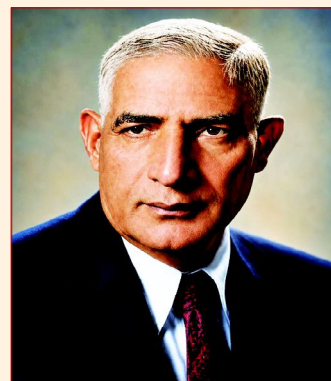
Mehta Kasturi Lal Mohan (01 April 1922 – 05 June 1999)
